

SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACTS FOR POSTER PRESENTATIONS

The deadline for abstract submission is **September 15, 2022**. Submissions received after this deadline will not be considered.

Please use a word file and submit it to office@emca-online.eu as attached file **with your last name being the file name**.

Abstract guidelines

Only abstracts for poster presentations will be accepted since beside the introductory lectures by invited speakers, there will be no oral presentations but an extended poster session. Abstracts must be submitted (and will be presented) in English using UK English spelling with accurate grammar and spelling suitable for publication. The recommended abstract length is **between 200 and 300 words**. Do not send supplemental materials (photos, articles or reports) with your abstract. All abstracts submitted before September 15, will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee of the workshop. The content of the poster should relate to one of your experiences in best practices for mosquito control.

The primary/submitting author will receive an email message confirming the receipt of the abstract and he/she should notify his/her co-authors that the confirmation has been received. The primary/submitting author will receive a confirmation of acceptance for poster presentation, or rejection, by e-mail before September 30, 2022. All accepted abstracts will be published in the e-abstract book.

Withdrawal policy: If authors wish to withdraw their abstracts from presentation or publication they are requested to send a letter via e-mail to the conference secretariat before September 30. Consequently the abstract will not be presented nor published.

General format:

- ❖ **Category:** Only poster presentations will be accepted (see introduction)
- ❖ **Dimensions:** Posters must be designed to fit within the confines of a 110 cm high x 170 cm wide poster board and consist of materials that can be mounted easily.
- ❖ **Title:** Maximum **200 characters** including spaces, typed in lower-case letters, except for abbreviations, the first letter of title, pronouns and study names. Use Calibri font 13pt bold for title. Abstract titles should be brief, clearly indicating the nature of your presentation. Do not include authors, institutions, city names, trademarks and abbreviations in the title. Please **do not** use a period, or bold, or ALL CAPS, or place your title in quotes.
- ❖ **Author(s):** Your abstract must list at least 1 author in order to be submitted. Use Calibri font 11pt. Please do not include tables, charts, or other figures in the abstract content. Please do not write given or family names in ALL CAPS
- ❖ Please note that presenting author should be in **bold and underlined**. If there is only one affiliation, do not use numbering. The names of authors will be published as listed. Please make sure you have entered the full list of authors and that the information given for each author is correct, as no changes will be possible after the abstract is submitted.

- ❖ **Affiliation:** There is no character limit for your authors or author affiliations.
- ❖ **Text body:** The recommended abstract length **is between 200 and 300 words**. Use Calibri font 11pt
This limit includes the body of the abstract only.
- ❖ No audio visual equipment can be used.
- ❖ Please ensure your abstract and submission details are correct before submitting.

Important Procedural Information

- ❖ In order for an abstract to be accepted, beyond the acceptance from the scientific committee, a registration submission and the payment of registration fees of at least one author of the abstract are required.
